(TIGER - TRUMPET; SUSTEREN AREA)

- A. - T/U 1301 Site A89. Dive bombing mission. The 410th Fighter Squadron with 13 P-47 aircraft. "Birthplace" laid alternate red and white smoke which appeared to cover both targets. 24 bombs fell in smoke but due to low clouds and the smoke, individual hits not observed and results not observed. Peel off was made from 11,500 feet and bombs released from 3,500 feet. Squadron was over the target area from 1345 hours to 1410 hours. Flak encountered: light, intense, accurate over Koningsbosch, K-753740; heavy, intense, accurate in the vicinity of Duren, F-1245. Weather: 6/10 cloud cover, base 4,000 feet, top 5,000 feet, haze below, visibility unlimited above. T/D 1445 hours Site A-89.
